## Anniversary Organ Recital

On Sunday 17 September, we celebrated fifty years since the last major refurbishment and expansion of the Auburn Uniting Church organ with an afternoon recital.

Built in 1889 by Fincham & Hobday, the organ was first played at the opening of the Church in that year. In 1967, a third manual and more stops were added. This has resulted in a beautiful suburban church organ, which is carefully maintained and used for worship every Sunday, as well as other occasions throughout the year.

For the celebration, John Rivers was the accomplished guest organist. John was a pupil of Lindsay O'Neill, a prominent Melbourne organist who played at the opening recital in 1967. John has been organist at Holy Trinity Cathedral, Wangaratta, and All Saints Church, East St Kilda, and is now a freelance musician. John's programme included some works which had been performed by Mr O'Neill in 1967. The organ's varied stops and colours were highlighted by the items chosen. These included both early and modern works. John's playing was greatly appreciated by the responsive audience.

Among those in attendance were three gentlemen who had been at the 1967 opening: Brian Krahnert (AUC organist 1955-96); John Mallinson (organist) and John Maidment (organ historian). Brian was the organist at the time of the re-building, and lent his expertise to the tonal design of the re-built organ. We are forever grateful to Brian for his stewardship of the organ and choir over a period of time which will never be exceeded.

## Light Horse Commemorative Service

On Sunday 1 October, the Friends hosted a short commemorative service in the Church for the 4th Light Horse Regiment Memorial Association, to mark both the founding of the Regiment by the late Major General John K Forsyth, a member and Trustee of the Auburn Church, and the centenary, later that month, of the decisive charge at Beersheba by the Australian Light Horse. The service was conducted by the Rev Captain Ron Rosinsky, a Uniting Church minister and former chaplain to the 4th/19th/Prince of Wales's Light Horse. Graeme Cross officiated at the organ, and the Ad Hoc Singers were led by Bruce Macrae.



The service began with Psalm 46, previously used at the service of dedication of the plaque to Gen Forsyth in 1930, and likewise concluded with God Save the Queen [King in 1930]. In his homily, the chaplain drew on the text in Matthew 5:9 "Blessed are the peacemakers", to distinguish peace making from mere peace keeping.

### Thursday 19 April 2018: *The Great War through an Australian Artist's Eyes* - Arthur Streeton Paints the Western Front

Friends are honoured to have a presentation by Julie Dodds-Streeton on her late husband's grandfather's experience as a war artist in France. In the Hall, Hepburn St Hawthorn, at 7.30 for 8pm. Supper included in admission price. Proceeds to the Friends for Tower restoration. Bookings will open soon, but please reserve the date now.

The Hon Justice Julie Dodds-Streeton gained a first-class honours degree in History from the University of Melbourne, going on to complete an honours degree in law. She lectured at the Melbourne Law School before going to the bar. She took silk in 2001, was appointed to the Supreme Court of Victoria in 2002, the Court of Appeal in 2007 and the Federal Court in 2010. Since retiring from the Federal Court in 2013, she has been on the reserve list of the Supreme Court of Victoria, and was the Judge in Residence at the Melbourne Law School for 2017. Julie is an accomplished speaker, and has assembled an impressive collection of slides of Arthur Streeton's paintings of the Western Front. The talk is particularly relevant as we approach the centenary of the Australian victory at Villers-Bretonneux, on ANZAC Day 1918.
